Why Target OSY?

- fastest growing segment of the Migrant Education
 Program
- more than ever OSY are single instead of moving and living with families
- unique needs resulting from migrant lifestyle
- high risk of becoming marginalized
- need advocates to motivate and assist with learning how to access needed services
- little to no access to federal or state resources
- lack of education and English skills affects socioeconomic status

Advocacy Strategies for OSY

- Current COE and OSY Profile:
 - Working plan for advocate
 - Starting tools to identify OSY students reengage and provide appropriate lessons in life skills
- Ask open ended questions:
 - Where do you see yourself in one year?
 - Where do you see yourself living, driving which car, making how much?
